We do many things for our Parish. Our commitment of services include:

- Gift Donations: Yearly gifts to the Priest, Secretary, Endless Mountains Pregnancy Care Center, Toys for Kids, Giving Tree, Canton Food Pantry
- Income: Received from yearly Altar & Rosary Society envelopes, Harvest Supper, Christmas Bazaar, Pierogie sale, Yard Sale, and donations.

A BIG THANK YOU to all who take part in these events. Without the members of our Parish and community partaking of these events we would not be able to do the services we do for our Parish. Thank you one and all.

Recently we had a Joint Altar & Rosary Dinner (40+ attending). At this Dinner we celebrated two Women: Patricia Pepper-Woman of the Year 2022 and Judy Lepper-Honorary Woman of Past Years, for their service to the Parish. This is a yearly event since 1982.

For many years we have been saving money wishing for a new kitchen. We contributed \$10,000 to the new bathrooms which we needed and are extremely happy for. We are still hoping and saving money for some kitchen renovations in the future.
