





What is the 7 Sorrows Rosary?

MIDDLE AGES ORIGIN
The Rosary of the Seven
Sorrows dates back to the fourteenth century. Mary, Our Lady
of Sorrows, appeared to St. Bridget of Sweden and revealed
this Rosary devotion to her. St.
Bridget devoted her life to following in the footsteps of Christ
— truly caring for people in
need.



MODERN POPULARITY

The Rosary became popular again following the Marian apparitions in Kibeho, Rwanda, in the 1980s. During Mary's apparitions to Marie-Claire Mukangango, she assigned the young woman a mission to reintroduce this special Rosary to the world. Marie-Claire was killed in the genocide of over a million people in Rwanda.

Why do we pray the 7 Sorrows Rosary?

We pray this Rosary to learn to suffer with love, as Mary, the Mother of Jesus, did. The 7 Sorrows Rosary leads us to understand our suffering, sins, and sorrows. Doing so helps us better live a life of joy in the Lord so that we can serve others like St. Bridget and Marie-Claire did.

As we pray with Mary through her seven sorrows, we begin to feel empathy for her suffering, the suffering of her Son, our Savior, our neighbors, and our own.

How to Pray: 7 Sorrows Rosary {Shortened Version}

BEGIN

In the name of The Father, and The Son, and The Holy Spirit. Amen.

O God, come to my assistance.

O Lord, make haste to help me.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Pray 1 Hail Mary.

THE FIRST SWORD OF SORROW THE PROPHECY OF SIMEON

I grieve for thee, O Mary most sorrowful, in the affliction of thy tender heart at the prophecy of the holy and aged Simeon. Dear Mother, by thy heart so afflicted, obtain for me the virtue of humility and the gift of the holy fear of God.

Pray 1 Hail Mary.

THE SECOND SWORD OF SORROW
