#### News from the Knights **THANKSGIVING FOOD DRIVE** The Knights of Columbus will conduct a



ued generosity. There is a message from the Canton Area Food Pantry above


the food bin and on the parish website (in News from the Knights) with suggested items for now through the end of the year.
